### **Preface**

The principle of gender equality enshrined in the Indian Constitution not only grants equality to women, but also empowers the State to adopt measures of positive discrimination in favour of women. Government of Tripura, with its steadfast commitment to empower women across the state, lays emphasis on womenled development rather than mere women's development.

The State Government, in its developmental programs, has effectively taken up women centric initiatives like rural livelihood through NRLM and MGNREGS, improving health outcomes through POSHAN Abhiyan, Ujjwala and PMMVY, safety and wellness through One Stop Centre, Nirbhaya Fund, Women Helpline, Beti Bachao Beti Padhao and Swadhar Greh etc.

Government of Tripura, in its endeavour to empower women, has recently launched "Tripura Policy for Women, 2022" which aims at achieving effective implementation of the women centric extant programmes to saturation point.

Gender budgeting or Gender Responsive Budgeting is a process that focuses on reducing gender inequalities at all levels of policymaking and implementation. It aims at reprioritizing resources and expenditures and initiatives of the Government schemes after taking into account the needs and priorities of women.

Although Gender Budgeting was officially adopted by the State of Tripura during the year 2006-07, however, the State Government, in order to put more emphasis on it, has decided to introduce a separate booklet on **Gender Budget** as a part of the main Budget. This Gender Budget highlights major women centric schemes and the budget outlay.




## Percentage of Gender Budget from Total Development Outlay for FY 2022-23


